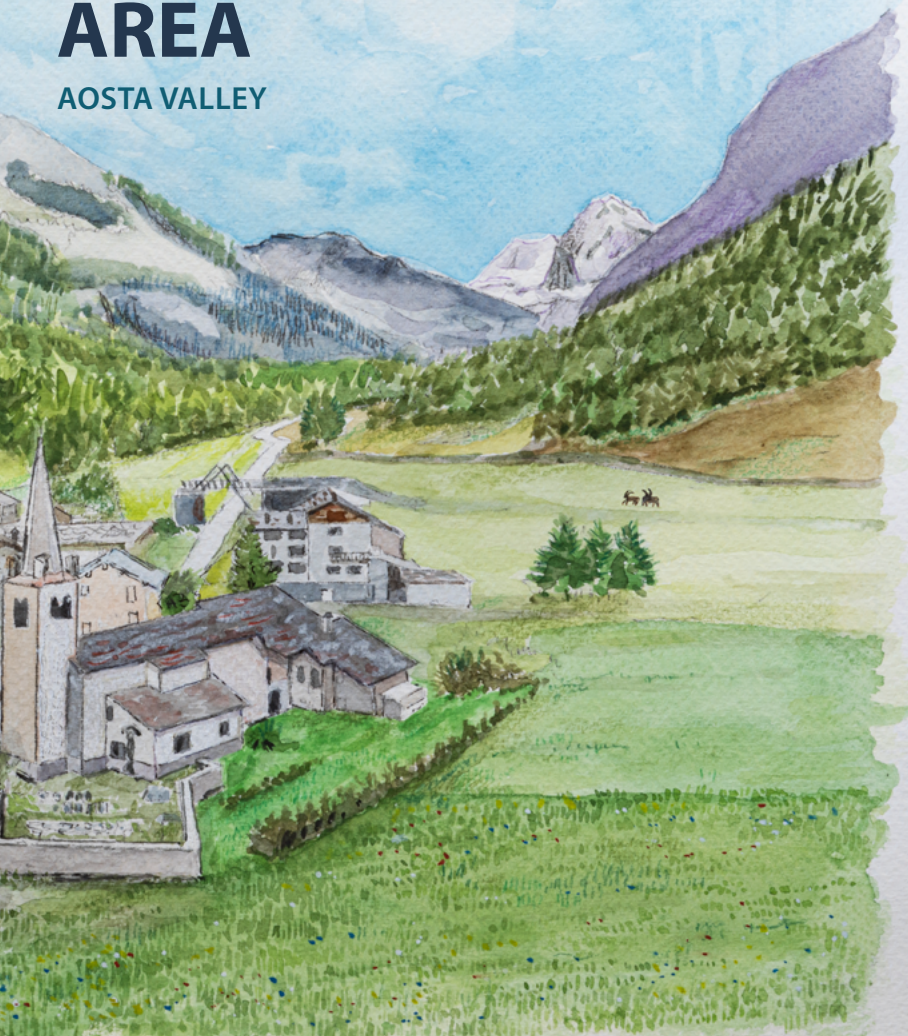

## DAMSELS AND GIANTS

Once upon a time there was a huge granite castle surmounted by ice towers and rock pinnacles. It was called "Gran Paradiso" and within its spacious chambers lived giants with skin of stone and eyes of iron.

Four sisters loved to play at their feet and, wherever they set eyes, the earth flourished, waters roared wildly and trees filled with fruit.

The girls soon grew into young maidens and in autumn their hair turned scarlet, pure white like diamonds in winter, the colour of wheat in summer and shiny emerald green in spring.

Captivated by such beauty, the giants began to compete for the hand of these young damsels. And so it came to pass that on Gran Paradiso blizzards, floods, earthquakes and storms were unleashed; the mountainsides crumbled and streams burst their banks, the population fled in fear and animals sought refuge in caves and bushes, but alas, nobody could escape the fury of the giants.

So, the sisters decided to put an end to this quarrelling and, with a heavy heart, chose to leave. For the last time they hugged each other, and left weeping.

From the first, who had violet eyes the colour of ripe grapes and red hair the colour of apples, were conceived the basins of Fallère and Vertosan, and her tears gave rise to the badlands, while from her fingers bloomed orchards and vines.

The second, who was wild and fearless and had the solemn expression of an ibex and the brisk pace of a chamois, sought refuge in the heart of the countryside, and from her hands rose larch and spruce woods, from her rain-soaked hair appeared the waters of Eaux Rousses in the valley that took the name of Valsavarenche.

The third sister settled a little beyond where eagles and hawks, bearded vultures and goshawks followed her in full flight. She kissed the land that accepted her – the Valley of Rhêmes – and from her lips rose the walls of Granta Parey, her warm breath melted the snows, creating the turquoise waters of Lake Pellaud.

Finally, the last sister ventured farther than all the others, leaving behind her a pure white blanket of snow. With her she carried a loom and, hidden among the mountains and impervious glaciers, began weaving the first drape of Valgrisenche...

Unlike other Italian protected reserves, Gran Paradiso National Park is the only one to have its own historical vigilance service, set up in 1947. Rangers' duties include monitoring and scientific research, in addition to supervisory activities and alpine rescue, which keeps them busy at all times throughout the year.

From dawn to dusk we keep watch over the flora and fauna. And I mean just that... I often spend the night out in rangers' huts but I willingly do that... and much more for my love of nature!

Let me come with you to the next hut. Who could be better than me to show you around this land of overwhelming charm?

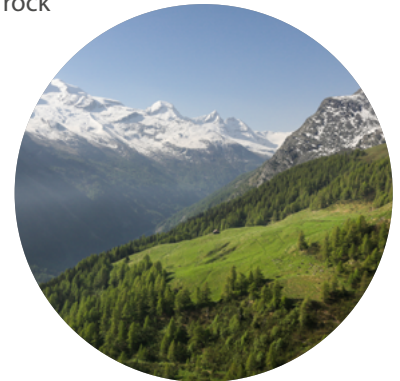
## GRAN PARADISO NATIONAL PARK

SUPREME BEAUTY OF THE ALPS

Get ready to admire the soft grassy expanses studded with white lilies that entwine gurgling streams and woods where tousled trees tower high.

Prepare to be left speechless in wonder before the crystal-clear water of lakes that reflect a limpid sky crossed by soaring eagles, or to listen to the infinite chanting of nature spread over 70,000 hectares of pure wonder.

Here chamois nimbly climb sheer rock faces and solemn ibex graze in silent, rugged pastures...

## ASCENT TO GRAN PARADISO

ALONG THE BACK OF THE SCALY DRAGON



Once upon a time there was a mountain range that resembled a granite cathedral with slender spires and walls scattered with pearly glaciers. It was crowned by the Gran Paradiso - the only 4,000 metre peak standing entirely within Italian territory.

This is a sought-after mountain which many have aspired to scale over the centuries, ascending amongst crevasses and jagged rocks. Aided by alpine guides, even non-experts like you can nowadays attempt the ascent, which can be reached from Valsavarenche in two days with an overnight stay at either Federico Chabod or Vittorio Emanuele II mountain hut.

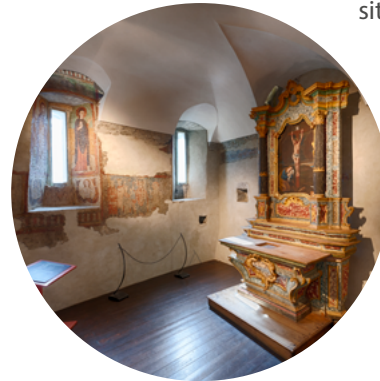

## SARRIOD DE LA TOUR CASTLE

MERMAIDS AND UNICORNS

This imposing donjon with crossed windows surrounded by defensive towers and a solid curtain wall, sits on a rocky spur overlooking the River Dora.



Despite its threatening appearance, this enchanting castle in actual fact harbours an artistic and dreamy nature, which is evident in the old chapel frescoes and in the “Hall of Heads”, whose ceiling is a multitude of corbels carved into intriguing characters, grotesque monsters and mythological creatures inspired by medieval bestiaries.

### THE INFINITE TRAIL

A mountain trail winding amongst sunny hills, sparkling lakes and meadows of fleeting splendour. It's an itinerary marked across flourishing countryside where you can stroll in the company of agile chamois, solemn ibex and bold marmots, stare at the clear blue where noble birds of prey hover above rock spires that reach up to the sky.



This extraordinary adventure from Courmayeur to Donnas takes you across all three Gran Paradiso valleys and to two of the most important nature parks in the Aosta Valley, at the same time offering you the chance to explore pleasant, quaint villages.

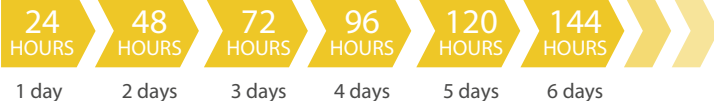

## DAYS ONE AND TWO

## 1 Valsavarenche

Spend your first day exploring Valsavarenche: set out early on an easy excursion to Pont (1A) at an altitude of 2,000 metres in the heart of Gran Paradiso National Park, among chamois and ibex.

Continue with a walk around the characteristic villages of Nex and Tignet (1B), then spend the rest of the afternoon at either Dégioz or Rovenaud Park Visitor Centre (1C), and finally treat yourself to a tour of Sarriod de la Tour Castle in Saint-Pierre (1D).

## 2 Valley of Rhêmes

After Valsavarenche, it's time to explore the Valley of Rhêmes: don your backpack and climb to Benevolo Hut (2A) – on foot or by bike – where you can enjoy a delicious lunch based on local specialities.

On the return trip, stop at small, enchanting Lake Pellaud (2B), then round off the day at Gran Paradiso National Park Visitor Centre at Chanavey hamlet (2C), where you can learn more about the bearded vulture and local birdlife in general.

# GRAN PARADISO AREA IN A WEEK

## DAYS THREE AND FOUR



### Valgrisenche

Enjoy a pleasant early morning walk along the footpath that flanks sparkling Lake Beauregard (3A). On reaching Valgrisenche, visit “Les Tisserands” artisanal co-operative (3B) to learn the ancient art of drap weaving, then drop into the Fontina ageing storehouse (3C) to taste this delicious cheese.

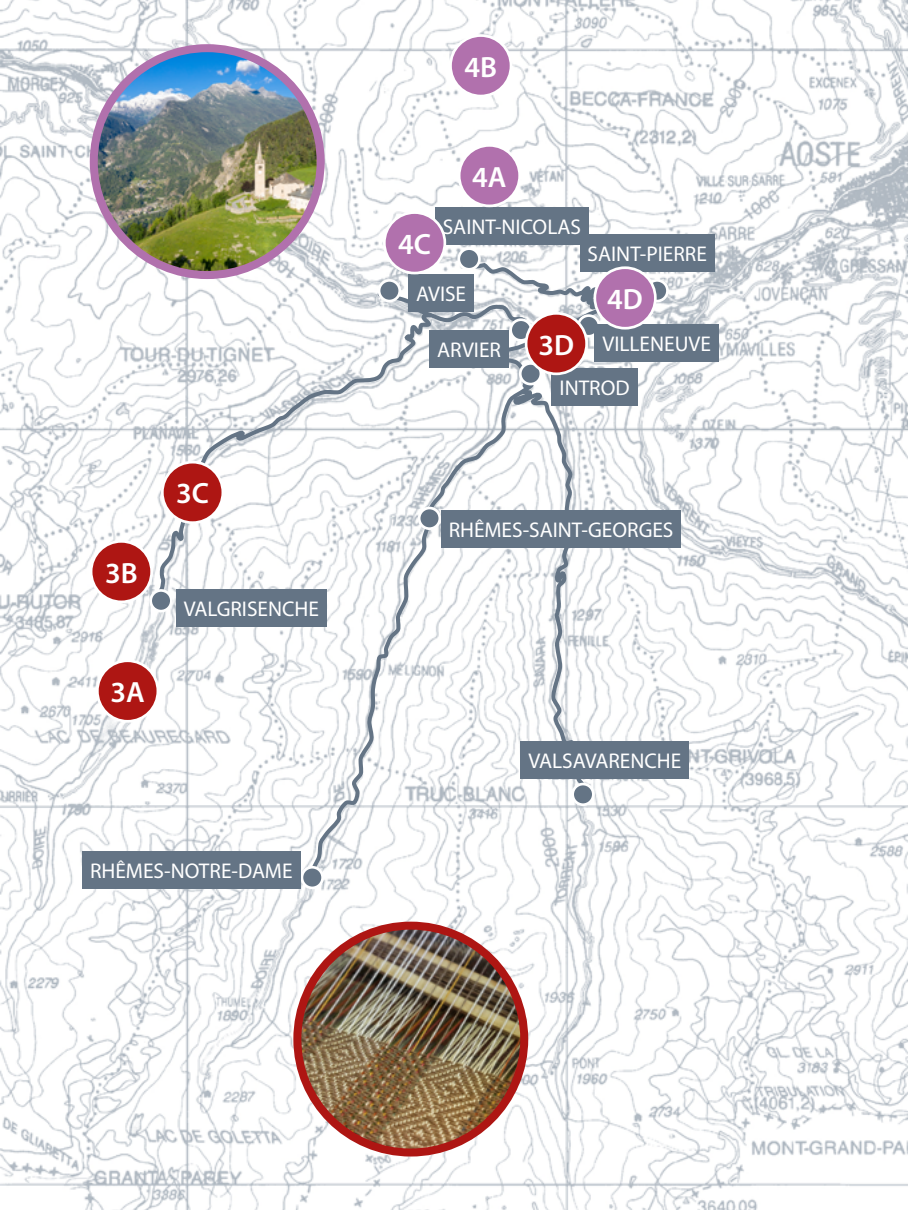
While returning, don't forget to take a short stop at evocative Châtel Argent Castle in Villeneuve (3D).



### Saint-Nicolas and Fallère

Reach the village of Vetan (4A) where the hike to Fallère Hut begins (4B). Along the route you'll come across a large number of amusing sculptures by Siro Viérin – an open-air museum where forest creatures, stern animals and comical characters thrive. Back in Vetan, go down to Saint-Nicolas (4C) and take a look around the village.

Round off the day with a visit to “Cofruits” in Saint-Pierre (4D), where you can stock up on local products.





## GRAN PARADISO AREA IN A WEEK

DAYS FIVE AND SIX

### 5 Panoramic spots, lakes and wine

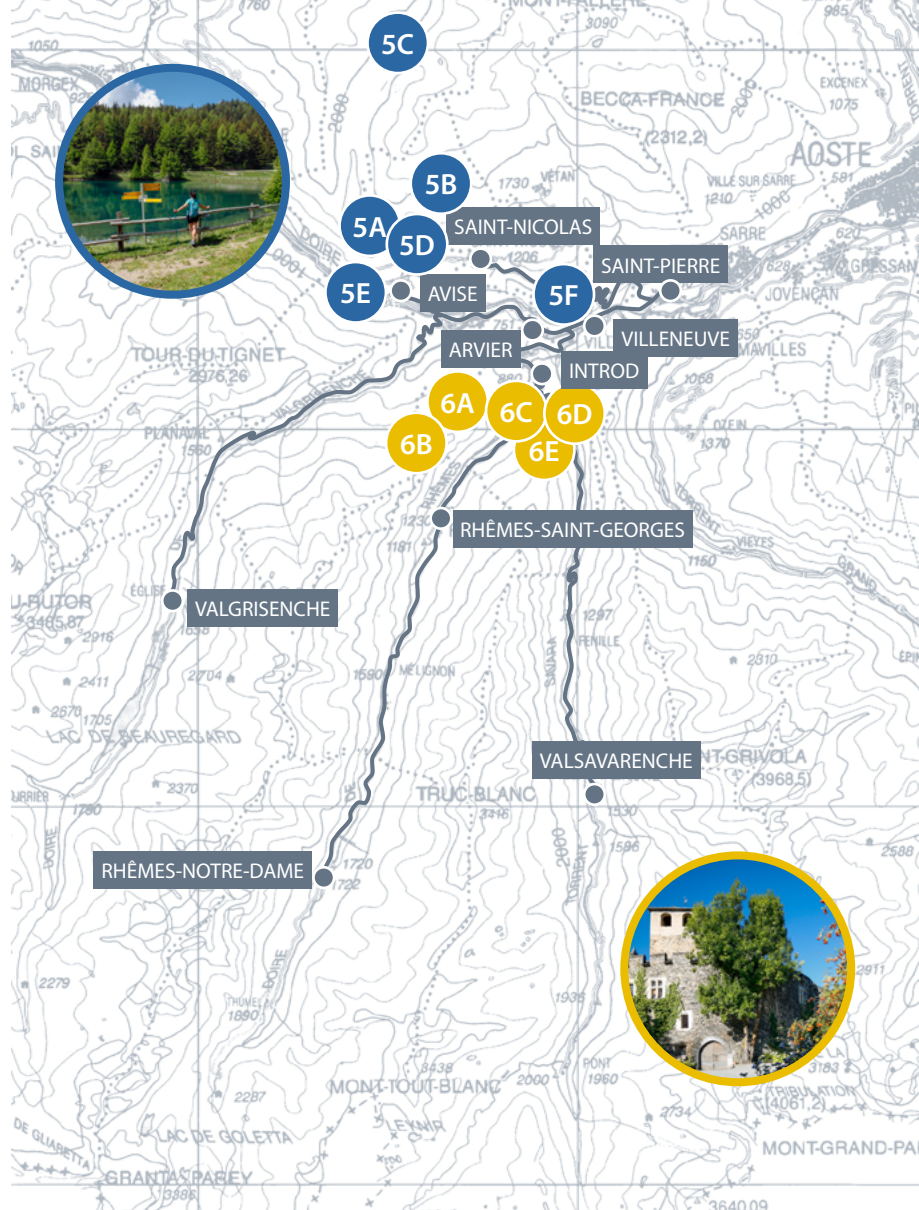
Start the day with a visit to the village of Vens (5A), which affords superb views of Mount Grivola and the valleys of Gran Paradiso National Park.

Continue to Lake Joux (5B) and, if you wish to hike a little further, continue along the valley of Vertosan (5C) on an e-bike. Return via the road to Cerellaz (5D), from which you can admire Mont Blanc, stop off at the village of Avise (5E) and lastly enjoy a wine tasting at one of the Torrette area's wine farms (5F).

### 6 Introd and Les Combes

Depart from the village of Les Combes in Introd (6A) and head towards Croix de Bouque (6B) via a meandering footpath that retraces the Popes' footsteps.

On reaching the cross and stone altar, stop to observe the magnificent view and valley below. Back in Les Combes, visit Maison Musée Jean Paul II (6C), then have a look around picturesque Introd Castle (6D) and finally bring the afternoon to a close at Parc Animalier (6E) in the company of local fauna.

# HISTORY ROLLS ON

## POPES AND CASTLES

## SAINT PIERRE CASTLE
