







Sinuous and soft, moulded by thousands of years of splendour, it delicately weaves its way through fertile hills. In each pearl swirl the dancing hues of indestructible stone and silky grass, silvery waters and juicy wine.

It's here that Mother Nature walks barefoot and with each step she takes trees and lakes, mountains and springs emerge, while her sweet breath is a warm breeze that protects villages from icy winds...







THE BLOOMING OF MILD **FULLNESS**

Picture a balmy summer's evening in a small mountain village: the main street is lit by soft street lamps and on the horizon the sunset is daubing gold and scarlet onto ribbons of clouds.

There, along the stone-paved streets, festive cheers, joyful music and snatches of conversation blend with the clinking of glasses, children's laughter and the sound of an audience applauding a show in the village square. On their way to the casino, the well-to-do stroll by in alluring garments, while others enjoy the benefits of a day spent soaking in rejuvenating thermal spa waters.

This enchanting picture is a true-to-life snapshot of Saint-Vincent, fondly called the "Riviera of the Alps". It's a town renown for hosting famous celebrities and champion football teams, for its exquisite pastries and the sacred mountain towering behind - Monte Zerbion, a natural panoramic viewpoint overlooking the colossal rock giants of Europe.

Saint-Vincent is the ideal departure point for exploring the central Aosta Valley, a land of rare beauty where the gaze is enraptured by the sight of bold manor houses and beguiling strongholds, where towers are scattered as liberally as legends.

It's impossible not to mention Fénis castle which, with its stone petticoats and battlements, appears to have escaped from a fairytale. Or even the castle named after Baron Gamba, with its picturesque English landscape garden where monumental trees whisper the secrets of a heart-wrenching love story.

It's another sort of passion that drives Chambave winegrowers, whose hills swathed in amber vines fill barrels with some of the most prestigious DOC wines of the region every year. These skills of the land recur among village mills and bread ovens, and along Pontey's golden Strada del Sole, where abandoned ancient millstones emerge from rocky cliffs like gems.

With its enchanted waters that turn green, its sparkling mines laden with treasures, and its evocative gardens, trust me when I say that you'll never stop discovering the wonders of this valley.

Bonjour, V m François, your guide!

Hey there, traveller! What a pleasure to meet you on my long, tiring journey!

Pardon? Do you want to know who I am?

Look carefully – see my dusty clothes and well-trod shoes. My skin may be scorched by the sun but the air with which I embrace the world is devout and cheerful.

Have you guessed?

That's right, I'm a pilgrim! Why don't you come with me some of the way? You'll keep me company and, step by step, past gentle hills and along shady mule tracks, I'll show you the ancient Via Francigena and shrines that nestle among the mountains...



The Central Aosta Valley is a crossroads of legendary routes used by thousands of pilgrims over the centuries to reach Rome and numerous local shrines. In fact, the Via Francigena and Roman Road to Gaul both wend their way between Saint-Vincent and Châtillon where Roman remains are still visible today.

GRAPES WITH A SECULAR FLAVOUR

Nestling side by side, the hills of Chambave afford a mellow view, like green mother hens busily protecting the town with their soft wooded claws.

Here, among gentle grassy rises reside the region's famous vineyards which burst into a riot of emerald in spring and summer, turn shades of copper in autumn, and then clothe in a dusting of white snow in winter. Renown

DOC wines, including highly regarded Muscat de Chambave are produced from the grapes grown here.

COL DE JOUX

THE ENCHANTING BOUNDARY



The mountain pass separating
Val d'Ayas and Saint-Vincent
is a spectacular boundary
swathed in pleasant forests
and suggestive meadows
with a view reaching as far as
the turquoise waters of the
River Dora Baltea and jagged
heights of Mont Blanc.

Adventurous excursions to surrounding peaks unwind amidst immortal firs and tapered larches, along with enjoyable walks through quaint villages and lakes the colour of periwinkle. In summer this pass blooms into a network of trails that are perfect for cycle rides, while in winter become a snowy paradise.

GAMBA CASTLE

A TIMELESS LOVE

This charming castle resulted from the heart-wrenching love story between a Valdostan countess and

a Piedmontese baron. Although the lives of these young lovers were shattered by cruel fate, the bond uniting them lives on among the high stone walls and decorated wood panelling.

This twentieth-century mansion surrounded by an aura of romanticism smiles at the sunny peaks from its mighty rocky perch, encircled by a delightful park containing extraordinarily beautiful exotic trees. Today the castle hosts

exhibitions, educational workshops and a valuable art collection.

MONTE ZERBION

HIGHER AND HIGHER

You'll feel on top of the world when your wonder-filled eyes caress the snowy summits of the Matterhorn, Monte Rosa, Mont Blanc and Gran Paradiso. A shot of adrenaline will hit you the instant your gaze rests on the endless expanses of Val d'Ayas and distant outline of the central valley, disappearing among villages, lanes and shimmering lakes.



This area can boast no better viewpoint than Monte Zerbion whose summit, inhabited by solemn ibex and protected by a silent, sacred sentinel, can be reached in many ways.



DAY ONE

Historical centre of Saint-Vincent

A walk immersed in the history of Saint-Vincent: take a visit to 20th-century Hotel Billia located along elegant Viale Piemonte, then to Piazza Cavalieri di Vittorio Veneto - the town's pulsing heart -, continue to the parish church, archaeological site, Roman bridge and mineralogy museum.

A tasty break with traditional torcetti biscuits

In the late morning drop into a pastry shop and try these delicious traditional biscuits. 4 Traditional supper in a town centre restaurant

Restore your energies by treating yourself to a supper based on traditional local products in one of the town centre's many restaurants.

3 Saint-Vincent Thermal Spa

After lunch treat yourself to a relaxing afternoon in the spa pools, Jacuzzis, saunas and Turkish bath! 5 Evening out at the Casinò

DAY TWO



Col de Joux and Sommarèse

Begin the day with an evocative hike to the heart of the countryside: take the unpaved road leading from Col de Joux (1,640 metres) to Sommarèse, in the municipality of Emarèse.

For a little over an hour this easy walk takes you along the Great Balcony of the Matterhorn trail (107), which winds amongst larch and spruce trees, affording an enchanting vista over the central valley and some of the Aosta Valley's majestic peaks. From here you can also reach Col Tzecore, where you can stop and rest at the picnic area.



Gamba Castle and park

Having concluded your outing, it's now time to stimulate the intellect, so taking a visit to Gamba Castle is an absolute must. The exhibition itinerary is rich in art works of timeless charm and includes paintings, sculptures, drawings, installations and photographs.

At the end of the tour, enjoy the sunshine in the surrounding English-style park, which contains some extraordinary monumental trees.

UNSPOILT SITES

AN ENDLESS GARDEN

It's not necessary to climb the highest peaks to discover nature's lush mountain treasures. Thanks to its modest gradients, Central Aosta Valley has a multitude of bodies of water and protected areas that create a promised land for passing birds and rare plant species.

This area of graceful wonder speaks out through multicoloured arboretums and wooded parks, where noble trees stretch out their wise, mighty roots, ready to embrace and veil you among the delicate rustling of their leaves.

LES ILES NATURE RISERVE

Wings beat, feathers flutter, a fish darts in rippling water: the lakes of enchanting Les Îles nature reserve await you with their elegant herons and multicoloured mallard ducks.



In a place where nothing is excessive, even recreational activities are more relaxing: soft expanses for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing turn into perfect Nordic walking or cycle trails in spring; well-groomed mule tracks are wonderful for horse rides; even the water courses and clouds offer numerous, unexpected forms of recreation...

If this is a sport you love then stop off at Champlong, where a network of winding panoramic roads take you and your poles through old larches, picturesque huts, lush mountain passes and spectacular glades.




SAINT-DENIS


